## The Principal Point

Summer did arrive magically for the camp for our Year 7 and 8 students and this meant that all the activities were able to happen on the day planned rather than be hastily reorganised because of inclement weather.

It really has been a busy term with lots of very exciting programmes in operation. Our Year 1 and 2 students are experts on butterflies, our Year 3 and 4 students have been looking at life

in the “olden days”, and our Year 5 and 6 are now incredibly tech-savvy but also have been looking at their responsibilities as digital citizens. Our Year 7 and 8 students not only survived camp but came back to school with a very strong sense of belonging to the Team that provides students with many leadership opportunities.

The school is always grateful to the many parents who contribute to the success of our programmes. We do appreciate this support and acknowledge that with the busyness of lives many families may not be able to support us with time during the day. This term we have had parents help us with the Team 4 camp, various trips and activities in different Teaching Teams, the Perceptual Motor Programme and QTT (Quality Time Together). Perhaps the greatest support that parents do provide is being there for their children and asking those important end of day questions about the day’s highlights as well as sharing reading, homework challenges and spelling words. A busy term for all – we trust everyone has a very relaxing and safe holiday and that some fine weather will continue to allow families to enjoy the outdoors. We return as a school on Monday 1 May at 8.55am.
